P_{resident's} Message

Our mission is to promote the education and earned benefits of all retirees of Kern County, advocate the safeguarding and continuation of Kern County retiree pension and health benefits, provide avenues of support and information for Kern County retirees and beneficiaries, ensure proper and necessary representation on the Kern County Board of Retirement, and participate as an integral contributor in our Kern County communities' quality of life.

Over the last two years we have all suffered through a great many hardships and negativity, so I've decided on a more positive message to all our retirees in this issue. I hope you enjoy this article which was sent to me some years ago:

GOD spelled backwards is DOG. (True Story) In 2003, police in Warwickshire, England, opened a garden shed and found a whimpering, cowering dog. The dog had been locked in a shed and abandoned. She was dirty, malnourished, and had quite clearly been abused.

In an act of kindness, the police took the dog, which was a female greyhound, to a Wildlife Sanctuary, which was known as a haven for animals that are abandoned, orphaned, or otherwise in need.

The sanctuary staff went to work with two aims: to restore the dog to full health, and to win her trust. It took several weeks, but eventually both goals were achieved. They named her Jasmine, and they started to think about finding her an adoptive home.

Jasmine, however, had other ideas. No one quite remembers how it came about, but Jasmine started

welcoming all animal arrivals at the sanctuary. It would not matter if it were a puppy, a fox cub, a rabbit or, any other lost or hurting animal. Jasmine would just peer into the box or cage and, when and where possible, deliver a welcoming lick.

The staff relates one of the early incidents. "We had two puppies that had been abandoned by a nearby railway line. One was a Lakeland Terrier cross and another was a Jack Russell Doberman cross. They were tiny when they arrived at the centre and Jasmine approached them and grabbed one by the scruff of the neck in her mouth and put him on the settee. Then she fetched the other one and sat down with them, cuddling them."

"But she was like that with all our animals, even the rabbits. She takes all the stress out of them, and it helps them to not only feel close to her, but to settle into their new surroundings."

Jasmine, the timid, abused, deserted waif, became the animal sanctuary's resident surrogate mother, a role for which she might have been born. The list of orphaned and abandoned youngsters she has cared for comprises five fox cubs, four badger cubs, fifteen chicks, eight guinea pigs, two stray puppies, fifteen rabbits and one roe deer fawn. Tiny Bramble, eleven weeks old, was found semi-conscious in a field. Upon arrival at the sanctuary, Jasmine cuddled up to her to keep her warm and then went into the full fostermum role. Jasmine the greyhound showers Bramble the roe deer with affection and makes sure nothing is matted.

Jasmine will continue to care for Bramble until she is old enough to be returned to woodland life. When that happens, Jasmine will not be lonely. She will be too busy showering love and affection on the next orphan or victim of abuse.

KCERA Retirement Board

"A retirement system board's duty to the system's participants and their beneficiaries shall take precedence over any other duty" (Section 17(b) of Article XVI of the California Constitution).

I hope everyone had an enjoyable St. Patrick's Day and Easter. I also wish everyone a safe Memorial Day. Since many of us are in an at risk health group, please adhere only to official medical advice in maintaining your health including a mask when advised. On the brighter side and as a reminder, your April pension payment will include a Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) rate of 2.5% to be applied to all retirees and beneficiaries. As always, direct all questions concerning your COLA to KCERA Administration.

During the March and April 2022 KCERA Board Meetings other than approving consent items (routine and non-controversial), the Board received presentations and took appropriate action on the following agenda items: Private Market Fund recommendations, Fiduciary Responsibility and Governance, selection of Actuarial Provider Segal, Alameda Decision Phase 4, Public Employees' Pension Reform Act (PEPRA) Implementation, Capital Efficiency Program and Annual Strategic Asset Allocation and Asset Allocation, 2022-2023 Chief Executive Officer Performance Evaluation Criteria, KCERA's voting delegation for State Association of County Retirement Systems (SACRS) and SACRS Board of Director Elections 2022-2023. The preceding list is not all inclusive, but Board and Committee Agendas and Minutes with supporting documentation are available for review at www.kcera.org.

As explained in earlier articles and to accomplish many of these responsibilities, the Board has established specific standing committees - administrative, finance, investment and nomination. The services of special consultants and professionals (accounting, actuarial, investment, legal, etc.) are required for the necessary committee due diligence before, during, and after preparation and submittal of recommendations to the Board for approval and action. Please understand that the Board reviews all matters thor-

oughly, but the committee system allows for the needed pick and shovel work - due diligence. The retirement administration plays an integral role in the support and completion of these duties and responsibilities.

The foundation for the many responsibilities of the Board and administration, other than the California Law (The 1937 Retirement Act), is a comprehensive governance structure. Governance enforces how a group agrees to work together by establishing chains of responsibility, authority, and communication. The objective of governance is to provide a decision framework so that decisions are made proactively to prevent delays in the operational and implementation processes. KCERA administration and management is a very complex, multifaceted operation. Many consider such pension programs the most demanding and complex public agencies.

During the February Board meeting Verus (Investment Consultant) presentation included the fund balance and investment performance (net of fees) for the period ended December 31, 2021 as follows:

Total Assets - \$5.557,439,932 1 Year - 13.7% 3 Years - 13.5% 5 Years - 9.8% 10 Years - 8.6%

As of June 30, 2020, the actuarial assumption rate was stated at 7.25% (expected long-term investment return) and current funding ratio of 64.4% (% of fund assets available to pay liabilities).

More detailed information and reporting may be obtained from the KCERA website at www.kcera.org. All members are encouraged to hear and/or view Retirement Board Meetings, usually on the second Wednesday of each month. The next meeting, however, will be held on May 4, 2022.

REOKC and KCERA

Everyone who receives a retirement pension from Kern County is a member of KCERA. However, not everyone who is a member of KCERA is also a member of REOKC.

To be a member of REOKC, members of KCERA must complete a form in order to have the \$2 dues deducted each month from their pension payments. Currently, about 63% of KCERA members are also members of REOKC.

So, why is being a member of REOKC important? The benefits are many: being able to take advantage of several insurances at discounted rates; graduating seniors who are relatives of REOKC members can apply for \$2,000 scholarships each year; being able to receive all 6 issues of the TREND each year.

In addition to the above, REOKC also maintains legal and consulting services to protect retiree benefits and pensions. REOKC's website is also a source of information and updates for Kern County retirees.

New View Access – Board of Retirement Meetings

We are excited to announce new access to live video of KCERA Board of Retirement meetings. Members, stakeholders and public now have the option to call in to listen to live audio or use a link to access live audio and video of Board meetings in progress. Instructions to participate in either manner are listed on the cover page of any meeting agenda, available on KCERA's website www.kcera.org.

Recent Salary Changes – Effect on FAC

Whenever your pensionable salary changes because of promotion, step increase, or other change, that amount will be reflected in your KCERA portal account a few weeks after payroll is processed. Your pension at retirement is based, in part, on your highest average pensionable earnings (referred to as final average compensation "FAC"). A salary increase will be fully included in your FAC after you have earned that amount over the required number of months. If you are a Legacy member, you must work twelve consecutive months at the higher salary for it to be fully included in your FAC. The FAC for PEPRA members is based on a three-year period. So, if you are a PEPRA member, you must work 36 consecutive months at a higher salary to be included in your FAC.

KCERA Office is Going Green!
